A drawing was held for a place at the fall retreat- Sandra C. won. The meeting was adjourned at 7:32 PM



The common pincushion can be an organizational tool.

Use a Sharpie pen to mark the sections according to your needs. You notice "EZ" listed on mine indicating easy-thread needles live in that section. Consider marking sections for machine needle sizes etc. In some cases, you don't need to mark the section, but simply separate various pins (hat pins?) or needles (tapestry?) by sight.
