Tid Bits

Laying out the "Mosaic" blocks one at a time seemed tedious (I had to think too hard). By cutting an inexpensive flannel-backed vinyl tablecloth into 20" squares, I created portable design walls. I could layout several blocks, stack them, carry them to the machine and sew continuously. The 20" size will handle the large blocks or a few smaller ones.
