June 20th Program Using Large Prints and Borders M. J. Fielek

Tid Bits

Remember "Stretch and Sew"? It's time for "Sew and Stretch"!

After hours at the sewing machine, cutting table or on the floor pin basting a quilt, take time to stretch. Some of the quilt magazines have published articles about yoga for quilters – check your stack or look online. Here are some very simple stretches for you to try.

Arms to your sides, shrug your shoulders towards your ears. Hold a few seconds then release. Repeat. Roll your shoulders forward a few times. Roll them backwards too.

Tilt your head so your right ear aims for your right shoulder. With your left hand down your side, stretch it towards the floor at the same time your head is tilted to the right. Breathe! Slowly switch sides.

Clasp your hands and reach them over your head. Turn so your palms are toward the ceiling (keeping your hands clasped). Grow taller! Keeping your hands clasped, lean your arms and torso to the right. Hold. Come back up, then go left. (You can do this seated or standing.)

Standing, form a "T" with your arms. Palms facing forward, reach your arms, still held at shoulder level, back squeezing your shoulder blades. Release and repeat. Turn your hands with palms facing back and try the stretch again. Feel the difference?

Stand, forming a star. Gently bring your hands together and bend forward, touching the floor. Shift your weight left and right by bending your legs. Come back up.

There are so many more! See what else you can find.

This tactile element brings quilts even closer to us, both literally and figuratively. They can both contain and conjure the most powerful and basic human meanings simply by their physical presence. No other type of art enjoys such close and easy access to the essence of our daily lives....."
