Mendie Cannon, Brazilian Embroidery

Mendie Cannon will present a program on Brazilian Embroidery, a style of embroidery that originated in Brazil in the 1960s. It uses a unique z-twist rayon thread. This thread and the stitches that designers create give this style of embroidery a three-dimensional look.

Mendie Cannon has been stitching in a variety of styles for over 40 years. She has been using Brazilian Embroidery for 10 years and became a certified instructor in 2007.

1. I will make up kits of blocks or strips and then ask you to only sew the top together and then BRING IT BACK THE NEXT MONTH!

2. I will add the backing and batting and then one of you can take it home and quilt as you wantstraight or curvy lines or angles or even circles and BRING IT BACK THE NEXT MONTH!

3. Then maybe someone else can bind it the next month and BRING IT BACK THE NEXT MONTH!

This way every 3 months, several different quilts get finished. This way no one is responsible for a whole quilt. I have the fabric (lots of it) and can work on kits as needed. Let me know what you think about this idea.
