Tid Bits

Almost a Log Cabin

- ♣ Pieces all the same size easier than a regular log cabin
- ♣ Great way to use smaller pieces of fabric (no 12 ½" strips)
- Quick easy construction
- **♣** There are no seams to match


Looking for another way to use red, white and blue strips for a Quilt of Valor, I found this pattern I must have picked up at a Quilt Show. The source is no longer online.

The directions make a 12" finished block and is perfect for a scrappy look. It uses eighteen $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " $x4 \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles in each block.

I used my portable design wall(s) – a flannel-backed vinyl tablecloth cut into 20" squares – to layout several blocks at one time. I didn't want them the same though you could do that if you wish.

- (1) Once laid out, it is easy to continuous sew as you sew 1+2; 5+6; 7+8; 9+10; 11+12; 13+14+15 and 16+17+18. Press.
- (2) Sew 3 and 4 to the 1+2 combo. Press.
- (3) Add 5+6 to the top and 7+8 to the bottom. Press
- (4) Add 9+10 and 11+12 to that square. Press
- (5) Add 13+14+15 to the top and 16+17+18 to the bottom. Press.
- (6) You are done!

I plan to sash my blocks with corner stones and add a border or two. You can simply sew all the blocks together. Play!!
