## Our Block of the Month Program

This year we are using red, white, and blue fabric blocks (one or more) to make tops for our Veterans program. There will be 9 different star block patterns. Instructions for each block will appear monthly in the newsletter and instructions for all 9 blocks will be on our website.

July Block of the Month: Disappearing Hourglass Star


This block may look difficult but if you follow each step closely and sew your seams a consistent $1 / 4 \prime$, it is really quite easy to make. And rows of blocks make a wonderful 2 -fabric (or multi-fabric) quilt. Have fun with it!

Fabric needed: Two $10 \frac{112 \prime \prime}{2}$ square, one either red or blue and one white.
Match the squares with right sides facing. Sew down each side, using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance.
Cut the sewn square diagonally both ways to make four half-square triangles.
Press the HST open with the colored fabric on top. Trim the dog ears top eliminate bulk.
Cut the block into thirds, each way, each third should measure $41 \not 2^{\prime \prime}$.

July Block of the Month: Disappearing Hourglass Star


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Fabric needed: Two $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " square, one either red or blue and one white.
Match the squares with right sides facing. Sew down each side, using a 1/4" seam allowance.
Cut the sewn square diagonally both ways to make four half-square triangles.
Press the HST open with the colored fabric on top. Trim the dog ears top eliminate bulk.
Fig 1: Arrange the 4 half-square triangles alternating light and dark to the center, as shown below, to make an hourglass block. Sew into 2 rows and press the seams toward the darker triangle. Sew the two rows together to complete the block. Press. Your hourglass block should measure $131 / 2^{\prime \prime}$, trim if needed.

Fig 2: Cut the block into thirds, each way, each third should measure $4 \frac{1}{2}$ ".
Fig 3: Turn each of the eight outside squares $180^{\circ}$
Fig 4: Turn the center block $90^{\circ}$.
Fog 5: Sew rows together nesting seams. You may want to repress the seams that intersect with the center square to nest them.


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
