

See Paula Z and Alice G. at the membership table.



Block of the Month

The Block of the Month for 2024 will be a **Mystery Quilt**. It is designed to be a patriotic quilt using red, white, and blue but feel free to choose your own color palette. The fabric needed specifications are if you follow the instructions given each month. You can alter the fabric colors, make it scrappy or change any of the designs to one you prefer. This will, of course, affect the fabric needed.

I happen to have a Wilmington patriotic layer cake and used about half of it, along with some fabric in my stash, to complete the quilt. One caution, you will need a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF in both red and white. The finished quilt will measure 46.5" x 48". You can alter the last row to larger blocks if you wish to make a bigger quilt. Just remember to include those blocks in the fabric requirements. QOV is minimum 60" x 80".

You will be making the blocks and then putting them together to make the quilt top. We will have a Mystery Quilt "Show & Tell" in September!

Fabrics Needed:

Background (light) 1-2/3 yd Red 3/4 yd Blue 1/2-yard Dark Blue FQ White 1/4 yard Green FQ Yellow FQ Brown FQ

Scraps will work for these colors.

I hope you enjoy making this quilt. Your participation is much appreciated for our Veterans program.

ALERT! The fabric needed shown is WITHOUT borders or if you add another row to make the quilt large enough for QOV standard size of 60" x 80". You will need to calculate extra fabric.

January Block of the Month

Happiest of New Years to you and your families!

This year's Block of the Month project is a mystery quilt entitled **"Home for Every Season"**. Each month a block pattern will be presented at the monthly meeting, in the newsletter and on our website. I'm hoping you will make 2 blocks: one for your quilt and one to make a quilt to donate to the Veteran's Program. This year you will keep the blocks you make each month. In September, you'll get finishing instructions to put the blocks together for a completed top. If you are going to participate in the project (and I'm really hoping you do), please let me know by signing up at the meeting or dropping me an email (roxygross6@gmail.com). I want to get an idea of how many quilts we will have for Veterans Day and to be able to send you some extra hints along the way.

I am excited to introduce the first block for this year's BOM mystery quit, the LeMoyne Star

Fabric Needed

Background: Four 3 ¹/₂" squares (corners) and four 4 ¹/₄" squares (for HST). One 2 ¹/₂" x 12 ¹/₂" strip (for top of the star block).

Four red 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ squares and four blue 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ squares (for HST).

Make four red & background HST & four blue & background HST. Using 4 ¹/₄" square, put right sides together, draw a diagonal line down the center and sew ¹/₄" on either side of the line. Cut along the line forming 2 HST. Iron with dark side on top. Trim to 3 ¹/₂".

Make four red & blue HST using the same method above.







Lay out squares as shown below and sew together. Unfinished block should measure $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $12 \frac{1}{2}$ ".



Sew a background strip $(2 \frac{1}{2} \times 12 \frac{1}{2})$ to the top of the star block.

Alternative: Make the star using 8 different color fabrics or make it using one color star fabric.
