"All About Improv"

Are you wondering what Improv quilting is? How it works? Or maybe you've never even heard of it before! Ellyn can't wait to share some of her modern quilts made with improv techniques and talk about what Improv quilting really means. Maybe after hearing about it, you'll want to give it a try yourself!

Bio of Ellyn's Quilting Journey...

Ellyn Zinsmeister began creating at a very early age. She quickly went from sorting buttons on the floor of her mom's sewing room to stitching pillows, bright colored halter tops, stuffed cows (don't ask), and homecoming dresses. During her college years she worked in a fabric store and her stash began to grow. Along the way she tried many crafts, counted cross stitch, painted wood shapes, even basket weaving, but always returned to fabric, her first love.

After a brief stint pretending to be an accountant (who was she kidding?) Ellyn began sewing baby clothes for the three adorable children she created with her husband, Rick. Nowadays she provides her grown up kids with an endless supply of pillows, aprons, patchwork towels and blankets. Eventually her mom convinced her to give quilting a try. Many quilts later, Ellyn is hooked!

A lover of journalling her whole life, Ellyn embraced the <u>blogging craze</u> in 2008 and Ellyn's place was born. Allen Crafters Market is coming in October!!!

Debra has volunteered to Chair this Committee with Elaine as Co-Chair. A committee to organize the event is needed. Who would like to help? There were some significant learnings from last year and the committee will need to decide what to sell this year and Volunteers to make items once we settle on what to sell. We have lots of material to help with any projects.

Block of the Month

The Block of the Month for 2024 will be a **Mystery Quilt**. It is designed to be a patriotic quilt using red, white, and blue but feel free to choose your own color palette. The fabric needed specifications are if you follow the instructions given each month. You can alter the fabric colors, make it scrappy or change any of the designs to ones you prefer. This will, of course, affect the fabric needed.

I happen to have a Wilmington patriotic layer cake and used about half of it, along with some fabric in my stash, to complete the quilt. One caution, you will need a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF in both red and white. The finished quilt will measure 46.5" x 48". You can alter the last row to larger blocks if you wish to make a bigger quilt. Just remember to include those blocks in the fabric requirements. QOV is minimum 60" x 80".

You will be making the blocks and then putting them together to make the quilt top. We will have a Mystery Quilt "Show & Tell" in September!

Fabrics Needed:

Background (light) 1-2/3 yd Red 3/4 yd Blue 1/2-yard Dark Blue FQ White 1/4 yard Green FQ Yellow FQ Brown FQ

Scraps will work for these colors.

I hope you enjoy making this quilt. Your participation is much appreciated for our Veterans program.

ALERT! The fabric needed shown is WITHOUT borders or if you add another row to make the quilt large enough for QOV standard size of 60" x 80". You will need to calculate extra fabric.

Block of the Month: April

Welcome to the Block of the Month for April. If you haven't started your blocks yet, this house block is a fun way to begin. If you need directions for the previous three blocks, they are on our website. Happy sewing, Roxy

Fabric needed:

House: one fat eighth (9" X 22") blue; one F8 darker blue. You will have some left for another block. Windows: four 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles yellow or color of your choice (red, white). Door: one 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", color of your choice.

Background: two 4 ½" x 4 ½" squares.

Roof: three 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares red or color of your choice.

Chimney unit: two background 2 ${\rm 1}{\rm 2}^{\prime\prime}$ x 5 ${\rm 1}{\rm 2}^{\prime\prime}$ rectangles and one chimney 2 ${\rm 1}{\rm 2}^{\prime\prime}$ square.

Make the left side of the house.

Cut six blue 2" x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles. Make two rows alternating blue, yellow, blue, yellow, blue squares. Layout vertically: 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " blue, window row, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " blue, window row, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " blue. Sew together.

Make the right side of house.

Cut door 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut dark blue one 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " and two 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " dark blue on either side of the door. Sew the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to the top of the door segment.

Sew the left and right sides of the house together.

Make the roof.

Cut three 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares red or color of your choice. Use two of the red squares to make two red & background HST. Sew HST, square, HST (as shown below) together.

Sew roof segment to house.

Make the chimney unit:

Sew a background 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to the right and left sides of the 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square chimney.

Sew chimney unit to house. Block should measure 12 1/2" x 20 1/2".







Window segment

left side of house

Add a background rectangle $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 20 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to the left and right of the completed house. Corrections for the previous three blocks are on our website.
