The Fourth of July is right around the corner! How about a flag block for your quilt or this block makes a nice pillow cover? You will need red, white, and blue fabric for this block. The white should not be the same as you are using for the background.

Fabric needed: Friendship Star corner of the block.
Two blue squares: $31 / 4$ inches by $31 / 4$ inches
Four blue squares: $21 / 2$ inches by $21 / 2$ inches
Two white squares: $31 / 4$ inches by $31 / 4$ inches
One white squares: $21 / 2$ inches by $21 / 2$ inches
Make two half square triangles using one blue and one white $31 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ by $31 / 4$ ". Draw a diagonal line, sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ on either side, cut on the line and iron with dark side on top. Trim to $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Repeat with the other blue and white $31 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares to make 4 total blue \& white HST. Layout squares as shone below and sew together. Block should measure $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. You could change this part of the block by choosing a different patriotic star pattern. There are quite a few of them on the internet.

Fabric Needed: Flag
Two red strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$; two red strip $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 15 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$
One white strip $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$; two white strips $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 151 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
Make a $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ block using $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips red, white, red.
Make a 15 1/2" block using $151 / 2 "$ strips white, red, white, red.
Sew the friendship star to left of the $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ flag strips. Sew the $151 / 2 \prime$ strips to the bottom.


Block should measure $14 \frac{1}{4 \prime \prime} \times 151 / 2 \prime$.
Sew a $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 14 \frac{1}{4}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ background strip to the left and right sides of the flag block.

If you would like to start putting your quilt together, sew Block 1 star to flag block to Block 2 hearts as shown below. This will become the second row of your quilt.
